

Minutes of Our Meeting of November 10, 2021

Meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm.

Officers in attendance were: President, Patrick Carpenter and Treasurer, Marty Hartzell. In attendance were 26 club members and one guest.

Minutes of the October 13, 2021 meeting were accepted. Gold was \$1,848.81 Silver was \$24.68

The November edition of the club's newsletter was mentioned. It was distributed on November 2nd. It featured articles about the club's in-person December meeting, some new coin varieties now recognized by PCGS, the discovery of an error on some of the new gold American Eagle coins, and the Pine Tree Shilling. There was also an article about the 1851 O three-cent piece, the only coin of that denomination with a mint mark. Thanks to Nelson Sagastume for putting it all together.

Upcoming coin shows were mentioned. Our club's coin shows in 2022 will be May 6 & 7 and September 23 & 24.

There was a discussion about the return on in-person coin club meetings starting in December. We will be meeting at a new location, Swanston Park Community Center, 2350 Northrop Avenue. There will be our holiday potluck meal, a coin auction, raffle and surprises. All full vaccinated club members are welcome. Members not yet fully vaccinated are encouraged to get vaccination shots soon so they can enjoy future club meetings.

Club dues were mentioned. \$10 is the annual dues for adults, \$5 for youths under 18 years of age. Some members had not yet paid their 2020 dues when our meetings stopped due to COVID. They will owe \$20 - \$10 for 2020 and \$10 for 2022. We did not charge dues for 2021.

The designs for the next four Innovation Dollars were displayed as was the designs for the series of commemorative coins celebrating Negro League Baseball.
