The reading of the minutes of our last meeting on May 11, 2022 were waived. The minutes were approved.

In attendance: 33 members and 6 guests.

Treasurer's Report: \$28,670 in coffers, but not yet paid for all of the bills associated with the coin show. The resulting total should be approximately \$18,000.

Old Business:

Picnic will be on Sunday June 12 at Tempo Park from noon to 2:30 or 3:00. SVCC will provide burgers, dogs and drinks. Attendees are requested to bring a side dish, salad or dessert. We will be playing coin bingo and there will be prizes.

New Business:

The SVCC board has approved a slight price increase to ticket books for the semi-annual Great Coin Giveaway, which will be in conjunction with our Fall coin show. Full books of 100 tickets will be \$75 and half books will be \$40. The number of books will no longer be limited to 80, but as more books are sold, more gold prizes will be made available. For each additional 5 books there will be a gold 2-1/2 pesos coin added to the prizes, up to a maximum of three additional gold coins. Tickets are now available for sale and Treasurer Marty H. indicated that we already have made sales – Yay!

It has been over five years since SVCC sold club shirts to members and it is time to do it

again. It will be a not-for-profit effort and a sign-up sheet was circulated. The exact price is not known, but will likely be between \$18 and \$25.
