Pat C. discussed the survey he recently sent out via e-mail to the general membership regarding a possible change in the schedule for 2023 our coin shows. Pat also had hard copies to be completed for those who do not have or cannot navigate the internet survey well. So far, Pat has received 31 responses of 110 sent and will update next meeting. Currently there has been a mix of responses.

For the coin giveaway, there will be 19 prizes and as many as three additional gold coin prizes will be added if ticket sales hit certain milestones, up to 100 books of tickets.

Mary Ann M. read a blurb from The California Numismatist, which gave kudos to SVCC for our energetic President and our newsletter creator, Nelson Sagastume. A very nice tribute to both! Thanks for sharing, Mary Ann!
